Travelling student praises flexibility and reputation of NZTC degree

With two young children, Sara had been looking for a Bachelor's degree in early childhood education for a while, having already studied baby care, youth care and counselling. The **Spanish** native was living in **India** with her husband when she discovered the flexibility of being able to study online with NZTC while caring for her children and working.

"I could never have stopped working and just gone to college for three years. This really is the only option that would have worked for me," said Sara.

Hailing from a large family, Sara has always been interested in early childhood development.

"Almost every job I've had has had something to do with children and their families," she said.

After completing her first two years of study in **India**, Sara relocated to **Germany** where she completed her final year of the Bachelor of Education (ECE).

"I would study on my phone on the train, or my favourite thing to do was print out all the readings and then on the way to work I would sit and highlight my papers. You don't need any frills for an online course; it's very simple," commented Sara.

Despite her extensive travel during her studies, Sara always felt supported and connected with NZTC.

"I felt a part of it, communicating with people in **China**, **India**, **Singapore** and **New Zealand**. Some of us are still good friends and we chat about our experiences," she said.

Sara's NZTC qualification has been recognised in **Germany**, and her employers are impressed with the content of her NZTC courses.

"If you have a degree from **New Zealand**, your qualification is highly respected. It automatically gives you credibility with people recognising straight away that you have a quality degree," she said.

When asked about the challenges of travelling, working, studying and caring for her young children, Sara explained, "There is never a right time. If you want to do it, just do it, even if the circumstances aren't perfect. I had friends tell me I was crazy as a working mum to take on a degree, but I think it was a good decision to just do it."

Having now completed her undergraduate degree, Sara is contemplating the next steps for her studies and career progression.

"I would definitely like to get a masters degree. I've always had a dream of working with United Nation agencies in the field of early childhood, so supporting families and children will always be at the core of what I do."

# IMMIGRATING TO NEW ZEALAND'S REGIONS WILL SOON BECOME EASIER

# NZ Government announces new measures to encourage migrants to settle outside Auckland

The New Zealand Government has announced several incentives to encourage immigration outside the country's most populated city.

On 1 November 2015, several new measures supporting visa applicants will go into effect, including:

- Bonus points awarded to Skilled Migrants applying for residence with a job offer outside Auckland will triple from 10 to 30 – a significant portion of the 100 points needed for consideration. Recipients will be required to commit to a region for one year, up from the current three months
- Changes will be made to simplify the labour market test for residency applications
- Points awarded when planning to establish a business outside Auckland through the Entrepreneur Work Visa will double from 20 to 40, of the required 120

These changes are likely to benefit many of NZTC's international students and their families who wish to live and work in New Zealand. With our Christchurch Campus and Blended Learning option — which provides the flexibility needed to attend weekly international tutorials in Auckland while completing other academic and practical requirements further afield — studying with NZTC is an excellent opportunity to gain skills and experience that can lead to employment in New Zealand's regions.
